## International missions

### **Baptist World Aid (Baptist World Alliance)** **\$60,000**

Baptist World Aid is a part of the Baptist World Alliance which unites Baptists from 122 countries around the world to provide assistance to refugees, displaced persons, and others suffering from famine, war, and disaster. This ministry also funds projects designed for improvement and self-sufficiency of different people groups through agricultural, health and/or educational programs. The provision of Bibles, hymnals, religious printing, and church buildings is also included.

## Baptist Global Response

**\$40,000**

Baptist Global Response connects people in need with people who care. The “people in need” are those suffering from acute problems such as disasters, wars, epidemics, etc., as well as chronic ones including poverty, hunger, poor health, etc. The “people who care” are Southern Baptists who want to be involved in making a significant difference in the lives of needy people worldwide. BGR is a 21st-century partner of the International Mission Board to help implement a more effective and efficient international relief and development effort. So far this year they have aided almost one million people in over 3000 communities throughout the world.

## International Mission Board (Southern Baptist Convention)

In the last annual report these missionaries were responsible for 6,138 new church starts. 100% of the offering received goes to support field personnel. No administrative costs are a part of this offering.

## International Orality Network

**\$100,000**

The International Orality Network connects over 2000 organizations who desire to put God’s Word in the hands and hearts of people. Over 60% of the world’s population are oral learners. For some, they can read but desire to hear and for others they cannot read at all. So for many of these people, if a Bible were even in their language, they could not read it. ION seeks to make Jesus Christ accessible to these people by teaching churches how to orally communicate the life-changing Gospel. The desire is that through biblical storytelling new churches can be planted among unreached people groups. The entire amount of the offering will remain in the Asian region.

# Hong Kong home missions

## Inner City Ministries

\$138,000

Inner City Ministries is an evangelical, non-denominational Christian mission that is committed to sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with the South Asian community here in Hong Kong. ICM is a mission effort which involves a whole person ministry among the poor and marginalized, seeking to meet the spiritual, physical and emotional needs of those around them. Some of the work includes Kid's Clubs, sewing workshops, parenting classes, and young teens programs. Our offering includes two different parts. The first part is salary support for the ministry work of Caroline Simmick, with an amount of \$100,000. The second part is general support for the Inner City Ministries, with an amount of \$38,000.

## Tsz Kwong Community Service Link

\$68,000

Tsz Kwong Community Service Link is based in Kowloon City and seeks to serve and evangelize the poor. It provides services for kids, new immigrants, and elderly low income families through its programs: Creative Kingdom of Kids, New Arrival Family Community Network, and Grassroots Community Service Station for the Elderly.

## Christian Concern for the Homeless Association

**\$68,000**

Christian Concern for the Homeless Association is committed to caring for the physical, social, and spiritual needs of street sleepers, those who are at risk of being homeless, and people in poor housing – they all have no housing or lack an appropriate housing. In addition to reaching out to the homeless through regular visits, the Association operates a drop-in center and three transitory hostels. It also provides weekly Bible study and Sunday worship services for its members.

The Chaplain's Office at HKBU is funded by churches and not the university. The office provides pastoral care for the University community at large. It serves as a facilitator for staff and students to gain a better understanding and appreciation of Christianity and to develop and grow in personal faith. The Chaplain's Office cultivates, encourages, fosters, and nurtures a caring community spirit within the University. It assists in preserving and promoting the Christian heritage, tradition, and atmosphere within HKBU. It engages students through the Christian Student Union, Christian Choir, Christian Band, Putonghua Fellowship, Cell Groups, Bible Studies, Noonday Worship, etc.
